Building Effective Relationships with Pueblo Communities.

- **Credibility is established early.**
- **Undivided attention.**
- **Honor diversity within and among tribal communities.**
- **Be true to your word.**
- **Consistency.**
- **Listen without interruption.**
- **Allow time when speaking or listening even responses (ex: email)**
- **Organize the process.**



Building Relationships.

- Permission from Leadership to proceed with the Project.
- Point of Contact (Advisory Committee Member) - Collective
- Planning Teams (in each individual Pueblo) - Individual
- Knowing and understanding the time it takes to work within Tribal communities.

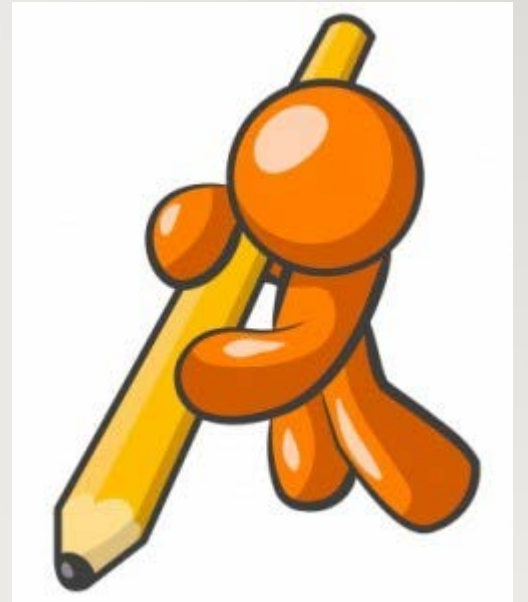

- Draw someone from your childhood that made an impact on your life.

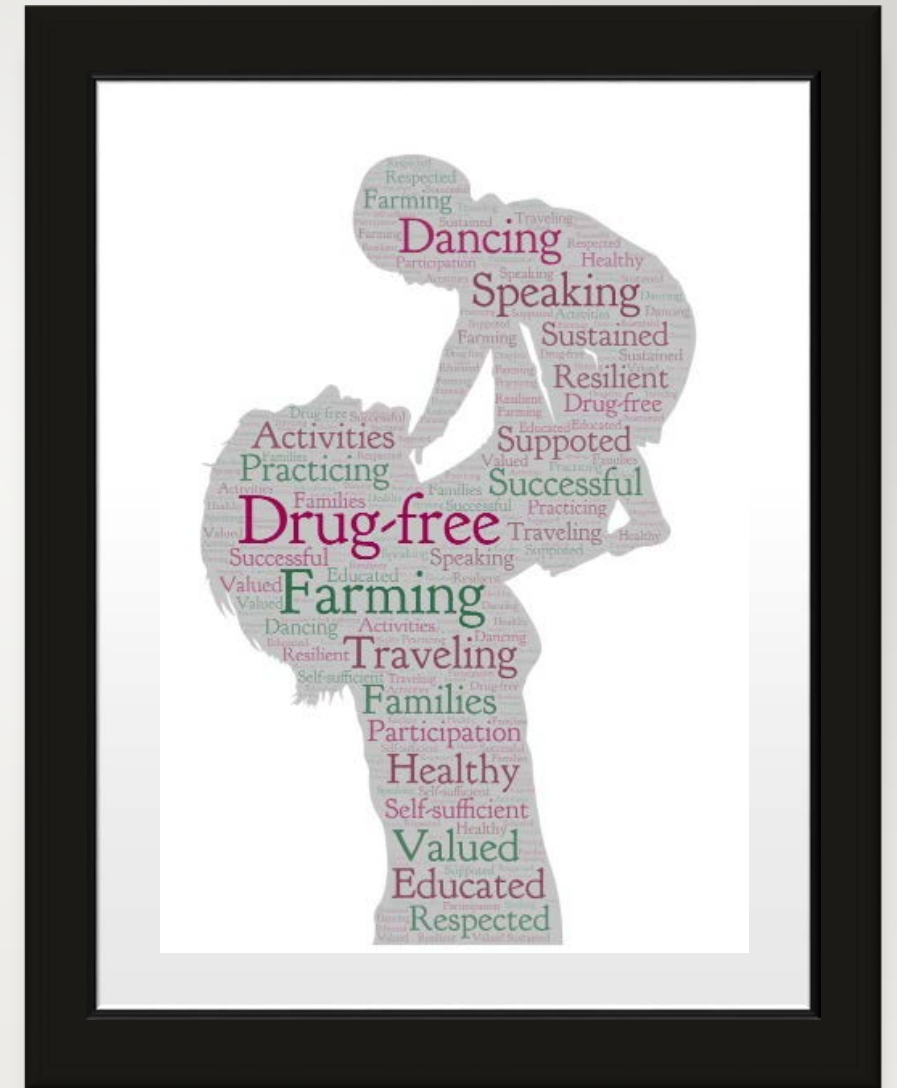

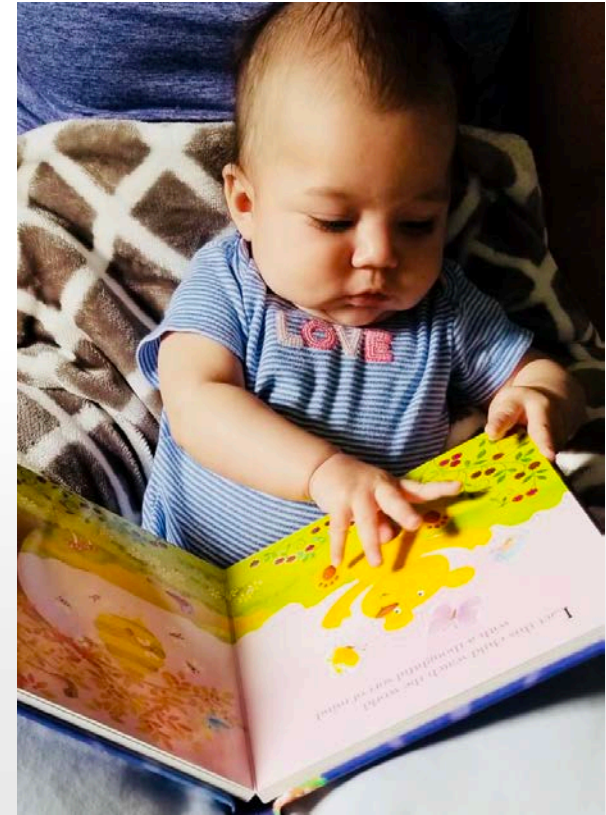
What is working in your community with Early Childhood?
