

Pregnancy Risk Assessment Monitoring System


Purpose



- Infant safety




Participant Selection

- Native American moms in New Mexico
 - Birth certificate
 - Gave birth in the past 2-6 months
 - Not randomly selected into NM PRAMS
- Invite 50% of remaining Navajo moms
- Invite 100% of remaining Pueblo & Apache moms
- Participation is voluntary



Multimodal Survey Administration

- Mail
- Online
- Telephone
- Survey packet delivery by WIC/CHR
- Incentive = \$20 gift card
